Objective of Session- The main objectives outlined by the speaker at the beginning of the lecture were:

 To explore the importance of human values in fostering harmonious relationships and societal well-being.

To reflect on the role of values in decision-making and ethical behavior.

• To highlight the connection between human values and individual growth, personal happiness, and success.

To encourage students to practice and adopt these values in both their academic and personal lives.

The expert lecture on "Human Values" was organized as part of the induction program for new college students. The lecture aimed to introduce the significance of human values in personal and professional life and to instill an understanding of how essential these values are for holistic development. - The speaker highlighted practical ways to apply these values in college life and beyond, such as:
 - Being honest with oneself and others in academic endeavors.
 - Practicing empathy while interacting with peers from diverse backgrounds.
 - · Cultivating respect for facility Astaff and alassmates.
 - Taking responsibility for persona Pana collective goals.

4. Human Values and Professional Growth

The lecture also discussed the impact thuman values on professional success, especially in a highly competitive and fast-paced work environment. It was noted that individuals who display integrity and ethical behavior are

often more successful in the long run, as they are trusted by colleagues and superiors.

5. Role of Values in Leadership and Social Impact

- The speaker pointed out that effective leaders are those who lead by example and uphold strong values. Moreover, human values contribute to creating a more just and harmonious society.
- The importance of volunteering, community service, and being socially responsible was emphasized as a way to practice and demonstrate values beyond individual pursuits.

Interactive Session


The lecture was followed by an interactive Q&A session where students shared their views and asked questions about implementing values in real-life situations. Some key topics raised included:
