**Objectives of Program:**

- 1) To create awareness among students about Adverse Drug Reactions (ADRs) and their impact on patient safety.
- 2) To highlight the importance of pharmacovigilance and the need for systematic reporting of ADRs in healthcare practice.
- 3) To educate participants on the methods, tools, and procedures for ADR reporting as per national and international guidelines.
- 4) To promote a culture of safe and rational use of medicines among future healthcare professionals.
- 5) To motivate students to contribute to improving patient care through responsible and ethical medication practices.

The event was coordinated under the guidance of faculty members and supported by the Maharashtra State Pharmacy Council.

The program commenced with a brief introduction highlighting the significance of Med Safety Week, its global relevance, and the need for responsible reporting of ADRs. The resource person, an expert in the field of pharmacovigilance, delivered an insightful and engaging session explaining how adverse drug reactions can affect patient safety and why it is vital to document and communicate them effectively.

During the session, the speaker elaborated on various aspects of pharmacovigilance systems, including:

- The process and importance of ADR reporting in India and worldwide.
- The roles of WHO, UMC, and national pharmacovigilance centers in monitoring drug safety.
- Methods for ensuring rational and safe use of medicines.
- Case studies illustrating the consequences of unreported ADRs.
- The contribution of healthcare professionals, pharmacists, and even engineering professionals in promoting medication safety through technology and awareness.

The lecture was highly interactive, with students actively participating in discussions and posing thoughtful questions about the real-world application of ADR reporting and the mechanisms through which it benefits society. The resource person also emphasized how young professionals can contribute to patient safety initiatives and support global efforts toward safer medication use.



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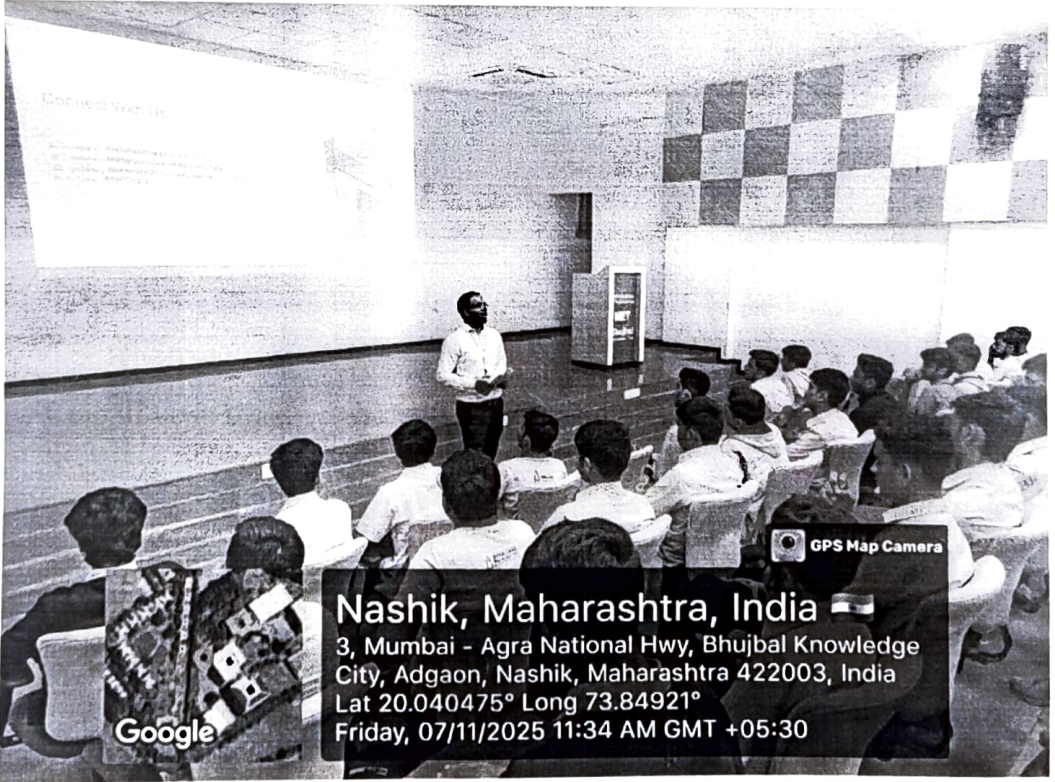
