

It was a week to remember! With diverse events that had something for everyone, the crowd was kept on their toes. Six super-charged events had the audience in a frenzy:


- BGMI Tournament: Gamers battled it out in the wildly popular Battlegrounds Mobile India (BGMI) game, bringing their A-game to the tournament.
